# ONCE UPON A TIME: BRINGING FAIRY TALE CHARACTERS TO LIFE

## What you will need:

- Your IMAGINATION
- Art supplies (like crayons, markers, glue, pipe cleaners, brown paper bags, paper plates, empty toilet paper & paper towel rolls, construction paper, tin foil, tape)
- Found items from outside like sticks and small rocks
- A sheet or big towel (make sure to get permission from adult)
- Glue (make sure to get help from an adult)
- Scissors (make sure to get help from an adult)

What is your favorite fairy tale character?

How can you create a costume to represent that character?

Once you create that costume, how can you make a prop?

What is a **prop**? A *prop* is short for *property of the actor* that they use on the stage or screen. Examples: Little Red Riding Hood's basket, Jack and Jill's water pail.

An example for creating a costume and prop for a fairy tale character: Use a sheet to make a cape and create a crown with paper plates and tin foil to be the Evil Queen from Snow White, and an apple by taking red construction paper into crumpling it into a ball.

*You can create your own fairy tale characters and stories to go with them!*
